

**Information on the processing of personal data under the Regulations  
of the Competition “My PhD in Three Minutes”**

1. The administrator of personal data is the Wrocław University of Environmental and Life Sciences with its registered office at ul. Norwida 25, 50-375 Wrocław, NIP: 896-000-53-54, REGON:000001867.
2. The Wrocław University of Environmental and Life Sciences has appointed a Data Protection Inspector (IOD), who can be contacted at the following e-mail address: [iod@upwr.edu.pl](mailto:iod@upwr.edu.pl).
3. Personal data will be processed in accordance with Art. 6 section 1 letter c GDPR, i.e. pursuant to the Law on Higher Education and Science, for the purpose of implementation tasks resulting from it.
4. Personal data will be processed for the purpose of accepting the application and for contact purposes in connection with the “My PhD in Three Minutes” Competition.
5. Providing personal data is voluntary, but necessary in order to register and participate in the “My PhD in Three Minutes” Competition.
6. Persons who provide personal data have the right to access the content of said data and the right to: rectify data, delete data, limit data processing, transfer data, objecting, withdrawing the consent in any time.
7. The committee will collect the following data: surname, given name, e-mail address, year of education, recording of a presentation and other data indicated in this form.
8. The committee declares that the data collected in the form will not be processed in any way automated and will not be subject to profiling.
9. The data collected in the form will not be made available to third parties, except: situations provided for by law and for necessary purposes for the functioning of the Wrocław University of Environmental and Life Sciences.
10. Personal data will be stored for no longer than necessary to achieve the purposes for which they are processed.
11. The administrator applies technical and organizational measures aimed at the protection of entrusted personal data in a way which is due and appropriate to the threats and categories of data protected.

12. Persons who provide their personal data have the right to file a complaint to the President of the Personal Data Protection Office.
